'Fees Can Fall' Student Award

The Centre for the Study of Governance Innovation in partnership with the action research network for a Wellbeing Economy in Africa (www.we-africa.org) is proud to announce a student award to enhance social and ecological wellbeing at UP.

We believe that the 'fees must fall' debate can open up space to turn our universities into places of 'wellbeing for all'. We're thus inviting UP students (individually or in a team) to design and implement innovative projects in 2017 that actually bring about social integration, solidarity, sustainability and equity at our university. Be creative: come up with innovative ideas to have a positive impact on the wellbeing of students and staff at all levels, and in any of our campuses.

Once your idea has been implemented, just send an e-mail to info@governanceinnovation.org with the following attachments: a two-page description of the project and its impact, as well as relevant documentary evidence (e.g. photos, videos, blog, artwork, written documents) that show the project in action.

The two best projects will receive a prize of **R25 000 each**, which will go towards paying the 2018 tuition fees of the students involved in the initiative. All other projects will be showcased on our website www.governanceinnovation.org.

To qualify, projects must be implemented between March and July 2017. Submission deadline is **31 July 2017**. The winners will be notified in August 2017 and the prizes will be awarded at a ceremony in September 2017.

This award represents a symbolic gesture that fees 'can' fall and that we can build a better university by working together towards shared goals.
